30. VICE-CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

Vice-Chancellor's Report (SEN2324-035)

NOTED

- 1. The report consisted of three key parts: a highlight report; a planning and student recruitment report; and a communications report.
- 2. The non-reaccreditation of ITE provision, and the actions underway to work with current students, applicants, and partner schools.
- 3. The challenging recruitment situation, particularly in relation to international students and postgraduate-taught, and the expectation of a highly competitive clearing process for 2024/25.
- 4. The University continued to operate in a very difficult financial position following several adverse movements and cost pressures. The Executive would be continuing to monitor the situation and to manage the budget to the levels agreed by Council.
- 6. During February, a delegation from the University had accepted the Queen's Anniversary Prize for excellence, innovation and outstanding work that delivered benefits to the wider world. The Prize recognised the unique research and expertise of a team of agricultural and biological parasitologists led by Professor Karl Hoffman in the Department of Life Sciences.
- 7. The anticipated change in Welsh Government regulations change for 2024/25 which would increase the cap on tuition fees to £9,250. Confirmation of Aberystwyth University fee levels for 2024/25 would follow.
- 8. Following its establishment in September 2023 as the new regulatory body, CETR would become fully operational from 1 August 2024. The expanded remit of the new body would help inform the University's strategic thinking, in alignment with the Welsh Government's Statement of Priorities.

- 2. The proposals, previously considered by Academic Board, and designed to replace the existing special circumstances processes for all assessments. Under 'Fit to Sit', students declaring as unfit would have an opportunity to defer assessment until the next available date, without a need to provide independent evidence of mitigating circumstances.
- 3. Members welcomed the overall aim of a reduced burden on students and a greater consistency in outcomes. Final approval would be subject to equality and Welsh Language impact assessments, and further clarification of the following areas:
 - (a) Achievement of learning outcomes where students were not fit to sit individual components.
 - (b) Any impact on the existing coursework extensions policy.
 - (c) Equality and Welsh Language impact assessments.

- (d) Modelling of impact on the volume of resit assessments and a review of the cap on summer resits.
- (e) Impact on group, practical and continuous assessments.
- (f) The status of draft coursework assessments for students declaring as Unfit to Sit.
- (g) The development of guidance and communications for both staff and students, and the establishment of an implementation group.
