

Appendix 2 – APPLICATION OF THE POLICY

Areas where the University may have contact with children, young people and adults at risk are as follows:-

- Teaching, supervision and support of students;
- Individuals employed by the University;
- Individuals undertaking work experience at the University;
- Students in University residences and individuals who attend residential events;
- Children and young people in University-owned or managed accommodation;
- Children and young people attending the University to carry out a sporting or recreational activity;
- Working with disabled students;
- Individuals who are research subjects;
- Research work, which involves direct physical contact with children and/or adults at risk;
- Widening participation and outreach activities with schools and colleges;
- Certain first degrees, master's degrees and PhDs (for example, in the fields of education, healthcare and veterinary science);
- Attendance at private functions run commercially by the University;
- Conferences;
- On placements and in other professional and clinical settings;
- Field trips, excursions & other activities such as volunteering and other social activities;
- The activities of student societies and networks on or off campus;
- Individuals who are on University premises on non-University organised events, for open days, or other University-organised events;
- Individuals attending University-organised events at venues away from University premises;
- Community sports projects;
- Photography of children for publication;
- First aid delivery;
- Christmas parties for children;

N.B. this is not an exhaustive list.

Please note, where students are registered with Aberystwyth University but are studying elsewhere, e.g. Erasmus, the host organisation's policy in relation to safeguarding will apply. Where there is no policy in place, Aberystwyth University's policy will apply.

Where students are registered with a Higher Education (HE) provider but the delivery of courses is subcontracted to another provider (in what are sometimes called 'franchise arrangements'), the HE provider has responsibility for ensuring arrangements are in place for its registered students.
