JOB PURPOSE

The role of the IEC English Summer School Teacher is to deliver high quality, task-based EFL teaching to international students on the summer English and Communicative Skills (ECS) course, or other short summer courses, and to contribute positively to the overall student experience on the ECS.

KEY DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES

TEACHING & ADMINISTRATION

To teach up to 21 hours per week on the English and Communicative Skills programme, or on other short Summer School courses

To deliver high quality teaching relevant and appropriate to the needs of the class group

To follow the syllabus, guidelines and methodologies specified by the Course Coordinator

To develop / select / utilise / create engaging and appropriate classroom teaching materials and contribute to a collection of materials for future use on similar courses

To ensure that topics, materials, methods and assessments are engaging, relevant and appropriate for the students

To contribute to the preparation and marking of student tests and assignments and assessments as required, and give formative feedback promptly

To plan effectively and keep up-to-date and accurate records, including a lesson-by-lesson register of class work and attendance

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- To work as part of the IEC team, liaising with the IEC Director, Course Coordinator, other teachers and other IEC staff as appropriate
- To provide tutorials, as appropriate and according to the needs of the students and the course
- To consult with the Course Coordinator and to make recommendations for future development of the programme
- To complete a Teacher Feedback Form at the end of the course

OTHER

To participate in an Induction Event before the start of the course and complete online Safeguarding, Equality & Diversity and Prevent Duty training before commencing teaching

- To work at all times to ensure that the quality of the student experience at IEC is of the highest standard
- To be available and on site within the 36.5 hour working week, from 08:45 to 17.15 from Monday to Thursday and from 08.45 to 16.15 on Friday with 1 hour lunch breaks (unless other specific arrangements are made with the Coordinator of the IEC) and to work for the duration of the course
- To attend welcome parties for each new cohort of students
- To treat all students and colleagues with respect at all times
- To maintain a professional manner at all times and uphold the reputation of the university
- To participate in course meetings, staff meetings and professional development workshops
- To act in accordance with the University's policies on Health and Safety, Safeguarding,
 Dignity and Respect at Work etc.
- Any other reasonable duties commensurate with the grade of the post.
