- 1. Think of a military conflict it can be one that happened in the past, or one that is ongoing today. Choose **one** side in that conflict, and ethically evaluate their decision to go to war using Just War Theory.
- 2. 'It is impossible for a conventional state military to totally defeat an insurgency'. Evaluate this statement, drawing on specific examples.
- 3. Do the benefits of nuclear deterrence, as a military strategy, outweigh its drawbacks? Justify your answer.
- 4. How should the United Kingdom define its 'grand-strategic' ambitions in the 21<sup>st</sup> century? Explain your answer.
- 5. Do technological innovations have the capacity to change the fundamental nature of war, as it is understood by Clausewitz? Answer with reference to **two** concrete examples of technological innovation in war.
- 6. 'Intelligence failures can be reliably eliminated if we simply learn from past mistakes'. Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
- 7. 'The use of torture for intelligence collection is justifiable, because it keeps ordinary citizens safe'. Evaluate this statement.
- 8. 'Civilian policymakers have no business making strategic decisions as they have no experience of military combat'. Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
