- 3. How did the Famine (1845-1850) impact upon relations between Ireland and Britain?
- 4. Why did Gladstone embrace Home Rule for Ireland? Why did he fail to achieve it?
- 5. Why did the forces of Unionism so fear Home Rule? How did they resist it before 1914?
- 6. How did British Crown forces seek to master the security situation in Ireland 1919 and 1921? Why did they fail? And was this failure inevitable?
- 7. To what extent was Éire's neutrality in the Second World War a fiction for domestic consumption in Éire?
- 8. Why was the Ulster Unionist Party (UUP) able to reign supreme in Northern Ireland from 1922 to 1969?
- 9. How did British security policy evolve in Northern Ireland during the first two Thatcher governments (1979-1987)?
- 10. Why, and how, did the leading paramilitary groups on both sides embrace ceasefires in Northern Ireland in the 1990s?
