- 1. What are the ethical problems that we encounter when studying 'Developing World' women? Can they be addressed effectively?

- 3. **Either:** Why have lesbian relationships in the global south only recently emerged from the shadows and into the political arena?

**Or:** Explore how Hijra people, or other non-gender conforming people in the Global South, negotiate dominant ideas about femininity.

- 4. What does the issue of 'the veil' tell us about gender and colonial relations?
- 5. Critically assess the statement: 'female politicians are always expected to act according to gender stereotypes and this always constrains their political power'.
- 6. Is participation in the market economy emancipatory for women in the Global South?
- 7. How does an intersectional approach to climate change, as experienced in the Global South, enhance our understanding of the problem and its solutions?
