DSA Computer Contributions:

- Aberystwyth University does NOT subsidise the £200 student contribution for PCs. Any registered student can apply to the Student Hardship Fund if they can demonstrate hardship; each application is considered on its own merits.

Learning and Teaching:

- Aberystwyth University requires that all lectures should be recorded and made available to students. All teaching spaces are equipped with **Panopto lecture capture** facilities. Recorded lectures are available via the students' AberLearn Blackboard.
